To all whom these presents shall come, greeting.

Know you, that we, for and in consideration of the sum of 50 shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted, paid into our treasury by **JAMES BRYNS** have given and granted, and by these presents to give and grant unto the said James BRYAN a tract of land containing 100 acres lying and being in our county of Orange on the waters of Little River;

beginning at a B0 running West 18 chains to a B0; North 16 chains to a R0; West 15 chains to a H; South 41 chains to a P0; East 21 chains to a B0 on a branch then down the branch to the first station. Bounded on the East by Hoggs Sand on the North by Woods.

As the plot hereunto annexed does appear; together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the said land belonging or appertaining: to hold to the said **JAMES BRYNS** his heirs and assigns, forever. Yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from time to time may direct. Provided always, that the said **JAMES BRYNS** shall cause this grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Orange within 12 months from the date hereof, otherwise the same Shelby void into no effect.

Bounded on the south by **TAYLOR & DAVIS** on their North by woods.
