China, from January 1886 to date hereof

And that I desire to remain a citizen of the United States and intend to return thereto on furlough to reside and perform the duties of citizenship within 1 year.

C. and is now deceased, that I have resided outside of the United States at the following places for the following periods.

CHINKIANG, China from 1886 to 1892
SHANGHAI, China from 1893 to 1923

and that I am domiciled in the United States temporarily being at Seminary Hills in the state of Texas, where I follow the occupation of Professor of Missions.

My last passport was obtained from the U. S. Consulate, SHANGHAI, China on April 13, 1920.

I intend to leave the United States from the port of San Francisco sailing on board the Shinyo Maru on July 24, 1923.
