




Indenture Made this twenty second day of January in the year of our Lord God One thousand seven hundred & seventy, and in the tenth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third, King of Great Britain &c by and Between Archibald Robinson and his wife Sarah of Troyon County & Province of North Carolina, of the one part, and William Robinson of the county and province aforesaid, farmer, of the other part Witnesses that for and in consideration of the sum of twenty six pounds procl^m. money to him in hand paid by the said W^m. Robinson at and before the ensembling and delivery of these presents, the receipt & payment whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, conveyed & confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, convey & confirm unto the said William Robinson his heirs & assigns forever, Three hundred & fifty acres of land out of a tract of land containing four hundred and fifty acres which the above named Archibald Robinson bought of William Millhouse, the said land was granted by his Majesty's patent to Matthew Floyd, in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and fifty four & bought of the s^d Matthew Floyd by the said William Millhouse three hundred & fifty acres of which land, the said Archibald Robinson & Sarah his wife doth grant bargain & sell, and by these presents hath bargained, sold, aliened, and confirmed unto the said William Robinson his heirs & assigns Three hundred & fifty acres of that tract.
