

4. State of North Carolina May Court 1812. The Petition of James Byram to the Worshipful Court held for Mecklenburg County, sheweth to your Worships that in a deed of conveyance from Zibulon Alexander to your petitioner for 240 acres of land the following Error appears in the fourth line of said survey to wit, in the deed of conveyance it runs from a Gum the 4th corner N 24 W. 96 poles to a P.O. ... Whereas in running N 20 E. we find the old lines marked and that course will lead to the P.O. corner called for; which Error has been discovered by actual survey by William Wilson proceper as will more fully appear to the Worshipful Court by the plat herunto annexed. Your petitioner prays your Worships that the said Error may be rectified in the Register books by an order of Court and your Petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray. James Byram

5. This Indenture made this 22nd day of November 1811. Between William Alexander of Mecklenburg County in North Carolina of the one part, and David Alexander of the same place of the other part. Witnesseth that for the consideration of the sum of 395 dollars in hand paid by the said David Alexander in hand paid the rec^t whereof is acknowledged by W^m Alexander both given granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed to the W^m David Alexander his heirs and assigns for ever. two tracts or parcels of land, each containing 100 acres, in all 200 acres - situate lying & being in said County and State on the waters of Stony Creek - Beginning at a B. Jack, a corner of Nash and Dobbs's barony land and runs N 5 W. 100 poles to a pine then S 50 W. 70 poles to a B. Jack and hickory then S 10 W. 72 poles to a hickory by the old corner P.O. then S 32 E. 60 poles to a hickory then N 87 E. 100 poles to a light wood knot, in the side of a shaft & then to the beginning. The other tract or survey, the courses and distances are as follows viz Situate lying and being on the Waters of Mellards Creek. Beginning at a B. Jack his own corner and runs N 00 E. 102 poles to a pine on William Shields line. then S 20 E. 30 poles to a B. Jack Maxwells corner by a road. then S 65 E. 80 poles to a P.O. by a road then S 10 W. 40 poles to a P.O. then S 67 W. 44 poles to a B. Jack by a branch. then S 02 W. 26 poles to a pine then S 36 W. 94 poles to an Ash on Alexander Robeson line. then with 2 of his lines ... N 20 E. 64 poles to a B.O. then N 10 W. 60 poles to a pine his own corner. & then to the beginning. The same. Viz. The first survey being granted to W^m Alexander by patent the 9th October 1703. The second survey granted to P^r W^m Alexander the 2nd day of August 1811. To have & to hold the said tracts of land with all the premises above mentioned to him the P^r David Alexander his heirs & assigns for ever. And do by these presents put the P^r David Alexander in full possession of all and every part of the above tracts of land. The P^r William Alexander doth by these presents Covenant for himself his heirs & assigns, to and with the P^r David Alexander his heirs and assigns. to put the P^r David Alexander in full possession for ever without any hindrance or molestation from him the said William Alexander his heirs or assigns for ever and to be free from any incumbrance. The said William Alexander doth Warrant & defend against all or any other person or persons, to the P^r David Alexander his heirs & assigns for ever. to have & to hold the above parcels of land, containing by actual survey 200 acres, be it more or less. 6. This Indenture made April 20th 1811. Between James Robeson of the one part & John Keiley of the other part both of Mecklenburg County in North Carolina. Witnesseth that for the sum of 75 dollars in hand paid, the rec^t whereof is now acknowledged. The P^r James Robeson hath given granted, sold aliened convey & confirmed unto the said John Keiley his heirs and assigns for ever, a certain piece or parcel of land in P^r County, on the waters of Keedy Creek. Viz. a part of James Robesons old survey - Beginning at a W.O. on the old line. running thence S 36 W. 76 poles to a Stake in the field. then S 6 E. 66 poles to a P.O. the old corner. then N 10 E. 60 poles to a Stake by the branch, and then with the old line to the beginning. containing 23 acres of land. Together with all Woods, waters, mines, Hereditaments & appurtenances, thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold
