James Byam and Robert Cook and
are held and firmly bound unto George Alexander Esquire,
Chairman of said court, in the sum of Two Hundred pounds

Alexander — or his successors: To the which payment well and truly,
to be made, we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators, jointly and severally,
firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this 26th
day of ~~January~~ Anno Domini 1801

THE CONDITION of this Obligation is such, That if the above bounden
Robert Cook — administrator of all
and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of John Bitman

deceased, do make or cause to be made, a true and perfect
inventory of all and singular the goods and chattels, rights and credits of the deceased,
which have or shall come to the hands, knowledge or possession of the said Robert
Cook — or into the hands or possession of any person or persons for
him; and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into Muhlburg
county court, within the time prescribed by law, after the date of these presents: And
the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the
deceased, at the time of his death, or which at any time hereafter shall come into the
hands or possession of the said Robert Cook — or into
the hands or possession of any other person or persons, for him do well and truly ad-
minister according to law; and further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account
of his said administration, agreeable to law, after the date of these presents: And all the
rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be found remaining upon
the said administrator account (the same being first allowed by the Governor and Council,
superior or county court) shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as
the same shall become due, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of the act in that
case made and provided. And if it shall appear that any will or testament was made by
the deceased, and the executor or executors therein named do exhibit the same in court,
making request to have it allowed and approved of accordingly, if the said Robert

Cook — above bounden, being thereunto re-
quired, do render and deliver the said letters on administration, (approbation of such testa-
ment being first had and made in the said court) then this obligation to be void, otherwise to
remain in full force and virtue.
