This Indenture made this thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-seven, Between Lewis Harris, of Augusta, lawful Deputy Sheriff of the County of Richmond in the said State of the one part, and James Senkins, of the said County, Esquire, of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Lewis Harris, Deputy Sheriff as aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of sixty dollars, to him in hand well and truly paid by the said James Senkins, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof, is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents, both as Deputy Sheriff aforesaid, grant, bargain and sell unto the said James Senkins, and to his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcel of land and mills on Rae's Creek in the County of Richmond aforesaid, containing three hundred acres; originally granted unto James Brewer, and also all that other tract or parcel of land (adjoining the above) containing three thousand acres be the same more or less, and run in

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
