To all to whom these presents shall come greeting  
 Know Ye, that we for and in consideration of the  
 sum of Fifty Shillings for every hundred acres  
 hereby granted paid into our Treasury by Blake  
 Bryan have given and granted and by these presents  
 do give and grant unto the said Blake Bryan  
 a tract of Land containing one hundred acres lying  
 and being in our County of Johnston on the  
 drains of Arthurs Branch joining Benjamin Lancas-  
 ters, Johns Seles, Johns Pool, and Williams Whittington  
 line. Beginning at a Red Oak in his own line  
 corner to Lancaster's tract and running with his  
 own line ~~East~~<sup>intended</sup> one hundred and eighty poles to a  
 pine in Arthurs branch. Thence South ninety poles  
 to a Red Oak. Thence East one hundred and eighty  
 poles to a stake in Lancasters then with the said  
 line North to the first station as by the plot here-  
 unto annexed doth appear. Together with all woods  
 waters, Mines, Minerals, hereditaments and appurten-  
 ances to the said Land belonging or appertaining.  
 To hold to the said Blake Bryan his heirs and assigns  
 forever. Yielding and paying to us such sums of Money  
 yearly or otherwise as our General assembly from  
 time to time may direct provided always that the  
 said Blake Bryan shall cause this grant to be reg-  
 istered in the Registers Office of our said County of  
 Johnston within twelve months from the date here-  
 of, otherwise the same shall be void and of no  
 effect. In testimony whereof we have caused  
 these our letters to be made patent, and our great  
 seal to be hereunto affixed. Witness Ricard Caswell  
 Esquire our Governor, Captain General and Commander  
 in Chief at Kinston the twenty fourth day of  
 September in the fourth year of our independence  
 and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven  
 hundred and Eighty five (1785)

State of North Carolina Chap. 873.

To all to whom these presents shall come knowing know ye that we for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty Shilling for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into our Treasury by William Hinton have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William Hinton a tract of Land containing five hundred acres lying and being in our County of Johnston near the head of Hinton's Mill Creek joining Dewsey - Perry Robert Gulley and Samuel Colliers. Beginning at a pine in Perry's line and running East Eighty poles to Gulley's Line, to two small Black jacks, thence with said line North one hundred and thirty poles to the corner. Thence with his other line East sixty poles to a pine. Thence North to Collier's corner, and with his line Two hundred and forty six poles to his other corner. Thence with his other Line West Two hundred and forty four Poles. To Malicki Hinton's corner Thence with his line South one hundred and thirty poles to a Red Oak his corner. Thence with his other line West two hundred and eighty poles to his own corner. Thence with his line South ninety poles Thence East seventy Poles to Perry's line, Thence North fifty six poles to the corner, and thence with Perry's line to the first Station as by the plot herunto annexed doth appear. Together with all woods, waters, mines, Minerals, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Land belonging or appertaining. To hold to the said William Hinton his heirs and assigns forever yielding and paying to us such sum of money yearly or otherwise as our General Assembly from time to time may direct provided always that the said William Hinton shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's office of our said County of Johnston, within twelve months from the date hereof otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect.
