THE STATE OF TENNESSEE--N^o. 1596

To all to whom these presents shall come...Greeting:

KNOW YE. That by virtue of certificates Nos. 598 and 599 for twenty five acres each issued by the Surveyor and Commissioner of West Tennessee to the aforesaid of the Register of the Western District dated 1st March 1826 and entered in the tenth Surveyors district by entry N^o. 2182 dated 7th June 1826 in the name of Thornton Jones aforesaid of said Register

There is granted by the state of Tennessee, unto *Thornton Jones*

A certain tract or parcel of Land, containing *Fifty acres, by survey* bearing date the 17th of June 1826 in the tenth district Range two and section five and in Hardeman County, bounded as follows: Beginning at a Stake and pointers thirty three poles south from the North West corner of entry N^o. 1350 for 56 acres in the name of Henry Marsh and runs West eighty poles to a White Oak. Thence North eighty poles to a stake and pointers. Thence East one hundred and fourteen poles to a black oak, thence South forty even poles to a Stake and two black oak pointers on the North boundary line of said Entry. Thence West with the line of the same thirty four poles to a Stake the North West corner of the same. Thence South thirty three poles to the beginning.

With the hereditaments and appurtenances. **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said *Thornton Jones* and his heirs forever. **In witness whereof,** *William Carroll* Governor of the State of Tennessee, hath hereunto set his hand, and caused the great seal of the state to be affixed, at *Nashville* on the 21st day of *July* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-thirty and of the Independence of the United States the 55th
