In the name of God Amen. Simon
Turner of the County of Wake and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind and perfect memory do make, constitute
and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following WIT.

Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my son John Turner
a part of a tract of land bought of James Jones, it being all
of the said tract lying and being on the N. side of Swift Creek.
Also a part of the tract whereon I live, Beginning on Beasley's Line
in the vaccon Branch running up the said branch, the East Forks
to the back line, and thence to conclude the whole of the said
Tract on that side of the branch. Allt. Three hundred acres
more or less, lying and being in the County of Duplin.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Winifred
Allt. negroes the one named Leah the other Quashiba
Allt. a bare mare named Tag, and a Feather Bed
and Furniture.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son MATH
a certain Tract or Parcel of land purchased of Richard
Haycock, lying and being on the North side of
Swift Creek, beginning at a Poles Line thence along
the said Poles line to his corner which runs East
thence to the Branch known by the name of Poles
Branch, thence up the said Branch to the Old Road
thence a North course to the back line, from thence
to the first Station. Allt. a Negro fellow
fellow named Hammond, and a bay Horse named Boych.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son David
a certain Tract or Parcel of land lying in the

Swamp containing Two Hundred and Fifty
Acres. Together with one hundred Acres
more by a Deed from the State Office joining
the said Land. Also, another Tract lying
on Buffalo Branch, on the North Side of
Middle Creek, containing Three Hundred
and Seventy Two Acres. Also. Two
Negroes, the one named Vester the other
Saac. Together with a Horse named
Sorrell.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son
William a certain Tract of Land lying and
being on the South Side of Swift Creek it being
part of a Tract purchased of James Jones
Also, a part of a Tract purchased of James Tate
deceased. Beginning on Swift Creek at
the mouth of the Log House Branch running
up the said Branch to Tate's back line
thence running South to his Corner, thence
East to James Tate's corner including
between 250 and 300 Acres. Also
a Tract of Two hundred Acres lying on
both Sides of the Cove Branch as by Deed will
appear bearing date the 9th August 1799
Also a negro Wench named Hannah
and another named Green. Together
with a Horse named Pleasant.

I give and bequeath unto my son
Jonathan the manor plantation together
with all my lands that are not already given
away. Exclusive of 140 Acres which will appear and
hereafter is given to my Daughter Polly
together with three hundred Acres lying in
Hemping Woods. Iiving James Tate's Line.
Also a Negro Wench named Chloe & a Dilley
named Flora.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Katharine one Negro Wench named Rachel.

I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Edith Two Negroes, the one named Abraham
the other Bedford.

I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Betsey, Two Negroes, the one
named Taddy, the other named Phillis.

I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Polly one Negro named Neger
And the together with the 140 Acres of Land
on the side of Black Creek in Johnson County.

In the last place I do hereby ^{give} and bequeath
unto my well Beloved Wife Anne. Two
Negroes, the one named Peter and the
other Cato, after the decease of my ~~Wife~~

of my Wife, it is my Will that the said Peter
shall fall to the Estate of my Son, Simon
Turner, as for my Stock remaining, I have
Directed Cattle &c. I give and bequeath
unto my Beloved Wife ^{Anne} upon Condition
she shall pay all Debts belonging to my Estate
I do hereby appoint my Wife Anne
my Son John, and my Son Simon, Sole
Executors of this my last Will and Testament
utterly revoking and disannulling all other
Wills and Testaments in any wise before
named Will or bequeathed ratifying and
confirming this and no other to be my last Will
and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand Seal this 9th of April in the Year
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
Eighty Three — Simon Turner
