

State of Tennessee Whereas Hardy Bryan On the second
 Montgomery County 3 day of November Instant 1824 died in our
 hearing the being each one of us personally present make his will
 or Declaration of Will after the following manner viz - The said
 Hardy Bryan did desire his Wife Martha Bryan and his
 son Simeon B. Bryan to act as his Executors and to sell so much
 of his Estate on a credit of Twelve Months as would pay off
 his debts and the balance of his Estate he willed should be
 kept together in One Common diviceous for the support of them-
 selves and for the supporting and Educating of his Children
 untill they arrive at the age of Twenty One years, then and
 at that time each Child should draw for him or herself
 the same proportion of his property, as he said Hardy Bryan
 had heretofore given, or let his son Simeon Bryan already
 have, which was as follows viz One good horse saddle & Bridle One
 good feather Bed and furniture One Cow and Calf one
 ewe and six Two One Sheep One Meadow two One narrow
 One the Trunk of One Bar Share and One Pair Iron Traces
 And when ever his little son Allen might arrive
 arrive at the age of Twenty One years then and at that time
 his tract of land (he now lives on) is to be sold to the highest
 bidder On a Credit of Twelve Months in Order to maintain
 an equal division amongst his said Wife and Children
 But if the said Wife Martha Bryan should die
 before his little son Allen J. W. Bryan becomes Twenty One
 years of age then and in that case her said (the now living)
 the said with all the other property held together as a diviceous
 is to be sold to the highest bidder On a Credit of Twelve
 Months in Order to be divided equally amongst the rest of
 his Children, now already provided for, after the manner
 of said son Simeon Bryan has heretofore received his portion
 of said Hardy Bryan's property, And after all the legacies
 have drawn their proportion in manner as given said son
 Simeon Bryan, then the balance of said Hardy Bryan's prop-
 erty of any, that balance is to be equally divided amongst

+ This Indenture made and entered into this the 16th day of April 1825 between Ebenezer Frost of Montgomery County & State of Tennessee of the first part & Isham Frost of the same County & State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, That the said Ebenezer Frost for & in consideration of the Natural Love & affection which he bears towards the said Isham Frost his son & for the further consideration of one Dollar to him in hand paid, the receipt in full of which is hereby acknowledged, hath this day bargained, sold, granted, aliened & confirmed & by these presents, doth grant, bargain, sell alien & confirm unto the said Isham Frost his heirs, Executors administrators & assigns, Three Negroes (twit), A Negro boy named Amos aged about Thirteen Years, A Negro Boy named Charley aged about three Years, and a Negro Girl named Caroline aged about three Years. To have & to hold the aforesaid Negroes boy Amos, Negro Boy Charley, & Negro Girl Caroline, and their further increase to the said Isham Frost his heirs Executors, administrators & assigns against the said Ebenezer Frost his heirs Executors, administrators and assigns, and every other person or persons who may claim, and by these presents do warrant and defend for ever. In Witness whereof the said Ebenezer Frost hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal, the day & date above written.
