Item 8<sup>th</sup> It is further my will that my loving wife sell my land in Virginia and lay out the money in young negroes for the use of my children & also my plantation on Buck Creek known by the name of West Harriess place

Item 9<sup>th</sup> I will that the whole of my property left my wife during her life at her death be equally divided amongst my children - Item 10<sup>th</sup> I will that all my land not mentioned be equally divided amongst my children.

Item 11<sup>th</sup> I nominate my loving wife & James Young Executors to this my last will and testament herunto revoking and renouncing & renouncing all other wills heretofore made by me In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand & seal the 28<sup>th</sup> day of January 1817
